We will have a very interesting meeting this month with Cottage Hospital representative Denise Filotas, who will share with us how to better prepare for a hospital stay. In addition, we will be sharing with Cottage Hospital, how to better communicate with us.

Most of us have experienced what it's like to stay in the hospital and the difficulties experienced in communicating with the staff. Despite having explained our hearing loss and our needs, it

doesn't seem to take long before those needs are forgotten or nurse tries to talk to you via the speaker system. Cottage Hospital is in the process of preparing a training module for their staff and will use the information they obtain from us in their training material.

This is a wonderful opportunity for us to join together and help educate Cottage Hospital on the needs of their hearing impaired patients; as well as the challenges and barriers we face. Hospital

stays are stressful enough; being hearing impaired and in the hospital makes it even more difficult and challenging.

Our meetings are captioned and our meeting room is Hearing Looped. We will provide refreshments and light snacks.

September Meeting Recap

We had a great meeting with Joe Pelett of Cochlear America in September. Joe was just awesome. He talked about Cochlear Implants (CI) and the Baha, two devices Cochlear Americas offers.

Baha stands for Bone Anchored Hearing Aid. A Baha works with the inner ear, bypassing the external and middle ear systems. This system allows sound to be conducted through the bone, rather than the middle ear.

A Cochlear Implant bypasses the

damaged middle ear and works directly with the auditory nerve.

As Joe explained, you would be either a candidate for a Baha or a CI, as they treat two different kinds of hearing loss. It was fascinating to learn that a Baha can be tested prior to having it surgically implanted by wearing the device with a removable head strap.

The Lobero is California's oldest, continuously operating theatre. Originally founded in 1873 and rebuilt in 1924, it is recognized as one of Santa Barbara's

architectural jewels and a State and City landmark. Therefore we are incredibly pleased that the Lobero is embracing hearing loop technology as the optimal way to create equal access for hard of hearing individuals. The theatre will be a great example to the rest of our community spaces who are considering creating this important access.

Important Information for Captioned Phone Users

Scam Alert: The below warning, which seems to be targeted towards CaptionCall owners, was just released Monday from the FCC.

The Commission has received information that consumers using Internet Protocol Captioned Telephone Relay Services (IP CTS) may have received calls from one or more persons purporting to be from the Federal Communications Commission (FCC), requesting the consumers to schedule a visit to the consumer's home regarding the consumer's IP CTS phone.

The purpose of this notice is to alert all IP CTS consumers that the FCC has not been scheduling any home visits to IP CTS consumers. If you receive a phone call from any individual claiming to be from the FCC who wants to schedule a home visit, we recommend that you do not provide any information to the caller, and do not agree to let the caller into your home. In addition, we request that

you please report such calls to the FCC's Disability Rights Office at [202-559-5158](tel:202-559-5158) (voice/videophone) or Gregory.Hlibok@fcc.gov

FCC Captioned Phone Regulations: If you use a Captioned Telephone, you will receive, or have received, a sticker you are required to place on your telephone. The sticker says, “Federal law prohibits anyone but registered users with hearing loss from using this device with the captions on.”

As you may remember, the FCC began implementing new IP CTS captioned phone regulations, in response to fast growing demand in the Relay Services. The FCC states that the regulations were implanted to protect IP-Based Captioned Telephone Services. The regulations have been highly securitized since the emergency order was issued in January 2013.

The final regulations, as of August

26th includes:

- Captions will not appear on the phone until the consumer turns the captions on, with exceptions made for people with documented physical or cognitive disabilities
- Consumers are required to pay \$75 or more for a captioned phone, unless the consumer receives the phone from a state equipment distribution program
- Apps (software applications) for mobile phones will cost \$75 or more, unless the consumer already has an IP CTS phone
- Consumers must register with the provider of the phone
- Consumers must certify under penalty of perjury that they have a hearing loss which requires the use of a captioned phone

The HLAA recommends education over regulations and has been filing comments in regards to these regulations.
